



SEARCH & RESCUE NIGHT TIME EXERCISE



On Wednesday, October 11th, Portland Fire Bureau Station #18, with its local NETs (primarily from Markham, AshCrest, Multnomah, Maplewood and Hayhurst neighborhoods), will provide a special advanced **nighttime** NET team building & emergency disaster response training at the Habitat for Humanity property (old UMC). The **nighttime** exercise will include **nighttime** operations; Interior\Exterior Search & Rescue, Victim Removal, Triage, Make Shift First Aid, Heavy Door Breach, Neighborhood\Building Size up plus a surprise or two to practice and sharpen individual and team skills.

NETs: **50-60 (participants individually or in up to teams of 6)** (see note below)

NET Trainers **6-12 NETs may register to be trainer with a fireman of a particular skill for future exercises (preference given to trainers of the previous exercises)**

NOTE: To participate in the exercise, each NET must have participated in one of the 3 prior Saturday exercises at the location. All participants are either NET\CERT Certified or has applied to Jeremy at PBEM to become a NET member that included signing the authorization for a background check, waiver, provided insurance information to him, has signed up for or is attending the Basic NET Training and is actively attending their respective neighborhood's NET meetings. Participants must also wear PPE gear and carry essential NET back and equipment similar to the FFE to become certified.

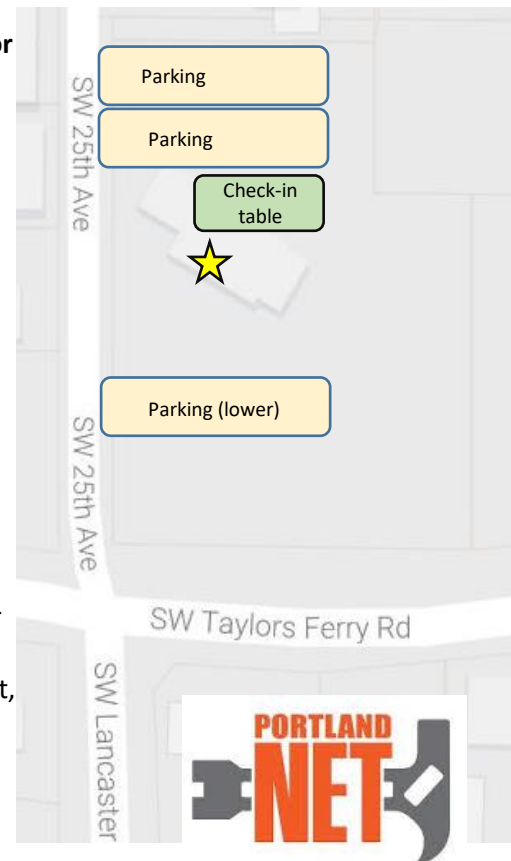
DATE\TIME: **Wednesday, October 11th, 6:00 pm Check in, 6:15 pm Start**
